LAF at Work—On Campus and In the Community

On Campus...LAF believes that the more men and women know about sex discrimination and the prevention policies in place at their institutions, the less sex discrimination will occur. Through campus outreach, LAF leaders and staff bring together students, faculty, and administrators to outline steps to prevent or resolve sex discrimination and to highlight the services available to women who challenge sex discrimination in higher education.

The Progress in Equity Award recognizes college and university programs that demonstrate significant progress toward equity for women on campus and in the community. The program receives a cash award of up to \$10,000 for the continuation of its work.

In the Community...LAF's Speaking Out for Justice Award recognizes a nationally prominent individual who has advocated change on behalf of women and girls. The award honors an individual who raises national attention and awareness on issues that reflect the mission and work of AAUW. An honorarium of \$5,000 accompanies the award.

Thanks again to all of you for your support of LAF, through your individual contributions and your support of our fundraising projects. We have met our goal for 2004 (\$6 per member) and begin now to set and meet a new goal for 2005.

Diversity Issues

The Middle East continues to be in the forefront of the news. A book which may help bridge the gap between American and Iranian culture from the perspective of an Iranian immigrant is *Saffron Sky : A Life Between Iran and America*, by Gelareh Asayesh.

This book is the vibrant, discerning memoir of a young newspaper journalist which depicts her immigration from Iran in 1977, her assimilation into American culture as a teenager, and her return to her native country in October 1990 as war loomed over the Persian Gulf.

What makes this work particularly effective is the manner in which Asayesh weaves her keen reporter's eye for objective detail with her almost poetic ability to describe and analyze her own emotional connection to the story. Her first-hand accounts of post-revolution Iran are as meticulous and perceptive as they are rare.

The heart of this memoir, however, is set in America, not Iran. Her ongoing attempt to forge a living connection between her home country and her new identity as an American is a well-crafted rearticulation of the central theme of immigrant literature the world over.
